Recommendation Challenge...

So far this year, there have been two months when I've had nothing to list on the 'Vivant, Hooray, and Congratulations!' page . . . and it's only April. (sadness) Their Majesties and Their Excellencies can't be everywhere, and can't see everything, all the time, so they must rely on us (all of us!) to provide insight and recommendations for awards. Too often we fail to think of truly deserving people, or we don't do anything because 'probably someone else already took care of this.' Or we think that we're not eligible to recommend a person for an award because we don't have that award ourselves. (Think: Kraken, Laurel, Nonpareil, etc.) And yes, I'm as guilty as anyone.

Recently, I saw a Recommendation Challenge that (apparently) started in the Kingdom of Atenveldt. I'm copying it here (adjusted to refer to Atlantian awards) in hopes that the ideas it lists will help stoke the fires and get the recommendations moving again.

Recommendation Challenge

- 1. Someone who has been playing for under 3 years no more people waiting 10, 14, or 18 years for AoAs. . .
- 2. Someone new to the thing you do (a specific art, fighting, service, etc. .
- ..). Reminder: the recommendation doesn't have to be for that thing.
- 3. Someone who has been doing the thing you do, for a while, but for an award not related to that thing.
- 4. A Peer or Pointy Hat who has gone without recognition for a long time.

- 5. A non-Peer / non-Pointy-Hat who has gone without recognition for a long time.
- 6. Someone in your Barony / Shire / College but not in your close circle / household.
- 7. Someone in another Barony / Shire / College.
- 8. Someone under 30.
- 9. Someone over 50.
- 10. An officer or deputy.
- 11. Someone you met in the last year.
- 12. Someone you have known since your first year.
- 13. Someone who taught you something or helped you with something.
- 14. Someone who does a thing that you don't find that interesting or enjoyable, but they do it well.
- 15. A youth two actually (one no more than age 12, for the Sea Urchin, and one 13-17, for the other Youth awards: Alcyon, Hippocampus, Sea Tyger, Arielle). Maybe a youth who is nearly 18 and should have an AoA.

 16. Someone who does a thing you wish you had time to do.
- 17. Someone you may not want to sit and chat with, but who undeniably does their thing well.
- 18. A group you see as a staple in Atlantia.
- 19. Someone whom you think of a part of a pair, but usually their Significant Other / friend gets the award.
- 20. Someone who has thanked or complimented you.

Felix Natalis MMDCCLXXI *Aprilis XXI, DCCLIII BC*

Romulus and Remus were born in Alba Longa, one of the ancient Latin cities near the future site of Rome. Their mother, Rhea Silvia was a vestal virgin and the daughter of the former king, Numitor, who had been displaced by his brother Amulius. In some sources, Rhea Silvia conceived them when their father, the god Mars visited her in a sacred grove dedicated to him. Through their mother, the twins were descended from Greek and Latin nobility.

Seeing them as a possible threat to his rule, King Amulius ordered them to be killed and they were abandoned on the bank of the Tiber River to die. They were saved by the god Tiberinus, Father of the River and survived with the care of others, at the site of what would eventually become Rome. In the most well-known episode, the twins were suckled by a she-wolf, in a cave now known as the Lupercal. Eventually, they were adopted by Faustulus, a shepherd. They grew up tending flocks, unaware of their true identities. Over time, their natural-born leadership abilities attracted a company of supporters from the community.

When they were young adults, they became involved in a dispute between supporters of Numitor and Amulius. As a result, Remus was taken prisoner and brought to Alba Longa. Both his grandfather and the king suspected his true identity. Romulus, meanwhile, had organized an effort to free his brother and set out with help for the city. During this time, they learned of their past and joined forces with their grandfather to restore him to the throne. Amulius was killed and Numitor was reinstated as king of Alba. The twins set out to build a city of their own.

After arriving back in the area of the seven hills, they disagreed about the hill upon which to build. Romulus preferred the Palatine Hill, above the Lupercal; Remus preferred the Aventine Hill. When they could not resolve the dispute, they agreed to seek the gods' approval through a contest of augury. Remus first saw 6 auspicious birds but soon afterward, Romulus saw 12, and claimed to have won divine approval. The new dispute furthered the contention between them. In the aftermath, Remus was killed either by Romulus or by one of his supporters. Romulus then went on to found the city of Rome, its institutions, government, military and religious traditions. He reigned for many years as its first king.

Although a debate continues, current scholarship offers little evidence supporting the Roman foundation myth, including a historical Romulus or Remus. Starting with Pictor, the written accounts must have reflected the commonly-held history of the city to some degree, as were not free to make things up. Historical bases for the broad mythological narrative remain unclear and disputed. The archaeologist Andrea Carandini is one of the very few modern scholars who accept Romulus and Remus as historical figures, based on the 1988 discovery of an ancient wall on the north slope of the Palatine Hill in Rome. Carandini dates the structure to the mid-8th century BC and names it the Murus Romuli. In 2007, archaeologists reported the discovery of the Lupercal beneath the home of Emperor Augustus, but a debate over the discovery continues.

Ancient pictures of the Roman twins usually follow certain symbolic traditions, depending on the legend they follow: they either show a shepherd, the she-wolf, the twins under a fig tree, and one or two birds (Livy, Plutarch); or they depict two shepherds, the she-wolf, the twins in a cave, seldom a fig tree, and never any birds (Dionysius of Halicarnassus).



The twins and the she-wolf were featured on what might be the earliest silver coins ever minted in Rome.
