### From the Seneschal's Pen...

Thoughts about Summer.

Summer is not 'icumin in'; it's here. As I write this (and it's not yet noon), the outdoor temperature is 96°! All of you understand the need for hydration and sunscreen at events. Even staying under a day shade is no guarantee against sunburn. But what about after you head home? How do you avoid that lethargic, drained, hit-by-a-truck feeling the next day? First and foremost, continue (even boost!) your fluid intake. Avoid alcohol and any caffeinated beverages: they'll only worsen any dehydration (which is the opposite of what you're trying to accomplish.) In the morning, eat a light meal that includes both some carbohydrates (for a quicker boost to your energy) and some protein (an egg, a slice of ham or even jerky) for a more gradual, longer-lasting boost to your energy and your electrolytes. Eat frequent snack-size meals or nibbles, rather than a large lunch and dinner. As much as post-event chores will allow, take it easy. That doesn't mean you have to sleep the day away, though. Feverishly sewing 14 new outfits whose fabric was bought just yesterday. Trying to alter the rules of time and space about packing 25 cubic feet of 'stuff' in a 20 cubic foot space. And replacing a lot of items that you really meant to take care of six months ago, but somehow never got around to. Sound familiar? For something that's supposed to be fun and a vacation, it often leaves many of us rather frazzled and frankly exhausted before we even arrive. Then there's the demands of setting up and catching up: setting up your small corner of Pennsic / WoW or -more demanding yet- trying to set up an entire encampment, while simultaneously squeezing in shopping trips and visits with friends we see only at Pennsic / WoW. So, with all this going on, things are bound to fall through the cracks. Oh No - now what?

Well, first - give yourself permission to be less than absolutely perfect. Somehow, we will survive and the world will go on. Remind yourself that This Is Supposed To Be Fun! (even if you have to mutter it through clenched teeth.) Many of us have responsibilities that don't end just because we're outside Atlantia's or the barony's borders. There are battles to be marshaled, devices 10 | Page to be drawn and fighters to be watered or patched up. Take time each day to do something just for the pure enjoyment of it. Have a siesta to recharge your batteries. But there are several things that you should take care of, no matter what. Before you leave for the War, make sure that all your shoes and boots are well-and-truly broken in (but not broken down.) Even if you bought three pair of shoes that are exactly like the ones you've always worn, they're not the same: they're new and haven't been made to conform to your feet like your old comfy shoes do.
