A Who's Who of Bring Your Own Yule

Yule is a winter Solstice festival historically observed by Germanic peoples, and participants at this year's Yule Toy Tourney were encouraged to bring Winter Solstice traditions from their persona's culture. Many cultures were represented, and even a few legendary characters made an appearance to help spread some fear... I mean cheer. They were Mari Lwyd, La Befana, Father Christmas, and Mrs. Claus.

The Mari Lwyd (or Y Fari Lwyd) is an ancient, pre-Christian winter Solstice



tradition from Wales involving a hobby horse with a horse skull head. There is some debate as to the origin of the name, but it is generally thought to mean gray mare. It may also refer to "mare", as in nightmare, which is a female monster supposed to settle upon people to pound them to suffocation. Regardless of the exact meaning and origin of the tradition, it is likely related to the idea of life overcoming death and a celebration of the transition back towards brighter days after the darkest days of winter.

There are variations on the Mari Lwyd tradition, but there are some common elements. All involve a horse skull mounted on a stick carried and accompanied by a group of people that go door to door (or pub to pub in modern days) challenging the occupants to a battle of witty verse. This rhyme contest is known as "pwnco" and consists of Mari Lwyd and her group trying to convince whoever is brave enough to show their faces at the door to let them in while those inside respond with rhymed reasons why they cannot come in. Mari Lwyd has a fondness for food and drink (especially ale), and if not sufficiently deterred, she will come in and help herself.

At Yule Toy Tourney XIV, a Bardic Smackdown was held between the Mari Lwyd and 3 of our most bravest wordsmiths, Master Hagar the Black, Baroness Machteld Cleine, and Baron Séamus Blaer de Maxwell. Mari Lwyd did her best to contrive reasons why the barony should let her in and allow her to feast and imbibe upon our supplies, but she proved no match for our clever bards.

La Befana is an Italian Epiphany tradition that some say dates back to the 13th century. The Epiphany is a Christian religious observance celebrated on January 6th, and it is more popular than Christmas day in many places in continental Europe. Even in the United Kingdom the popular 12 days of Christmas start on Christmas day and end with the Epiphany. In many countries Epiphany celebrations involve the three Magi, or wise men. Yet in many parts of Italy, it is La Befana who comes bearing gifts for children, and her name is thought to be a variation of the Italian word "epifania".



There are some variations to the La Befana myth, but a popular story blending of various popular stories) is that around the time of Jesus' birth, the three wise men stopped by La Befana's home and invited her to join them on their journey to follow the shining

star to pay homage to a new baby king. She was busy doing house work as she is a fastidious cleaner and declined their offer. Later, filled with regret, she jumped on her broom and flew off into the night sky to try to follow the star. She stopped at each house she came across and went down the chimney to look for the baby. When she encountered well behaved children, she gave them presents, but to the naughty, she gave coal.

Some say she never found that baby king but every year still goes out looking for him. Others says she did and was blessed with being named the godmother of all Italian

children. To this day, she is a popular character in Italy, and carbone della Befana, a candy that is made to look like coal, is given out during Epiphany celebrations, because we're all at least a little naughty sometimes. La Befana at Yule Toy Tourney XIV handed out candy coal to naughty Nottquillians and treated the archers to a game of DOLCE at the archery range.

Father Christmas is thought to have first made an appearance in the 16th century, but his origins go back farther. His predecessor, Saint Nicholas, is believed to be a Catholic bishop who lived in Myra, Asia Minor (now Turkey) during the 4th century and was generous to the poor and gave gifts to children. One legend regarding Saint Nicholas is that he dropped a bag of gold down a chimney to provide the dowry for a poor man's daughter, and it fell into her stocking.

Saint Nicholas' feast day is December 6th, and he was a popular subject for medieval artists and liturgical plays. Yet after the Reformation, Saint Nicholas fell out of favor in most all Protestant countries (except Holland) and was rebooted as Father Christmas, or Old Man Christmas. Father Christmas retained many of Saint Nicholas' traits, but not his religion.



Through the years Father Christmas has acquired newer traditional elements, and the Victorians even saw fit to give him a wife in the 19th century. In the Americas, the Dutch brought their custom of Sinterklaus to New Amsterdam, and the English-speaking majority transformed his name into Santa Clause. At this year's Yule Toy Tourney, like many before it, Father Christmas and Mrs. Claus stopped in to help spread holiday cheer and sweetened the atmosphere by handing out treats.

Yule Toy Tourney XIV saw a gathering of great company, but also absent friends were missed. Despite this, much mirth and merriment seemed to be had by all. Who knows what cast of characters next year's celebration will bring- perhaps a Pertcha, or Tomte, or

Jólakötturinn. Okay, hopefully not Pertcha, but some oliebollen would be nice. Happy Yule!

Tastings from the Wooden Spoon - Oliebollen

Merry Yuletide! Hopefully this is a new resurgence of TftWS. At our Yearly Baronial Yule Toy Tourney (where we collect toys for Country Santa), the theme was 'Bring Your Own Yule". Since a vigil bonfire was out of the question, I brought a tidbit I had researched and was usually well-received -Oliebollen, Dutch for "oily balls". Doughnuts have been around for centuries; the Grecians had Loukoumades, a bit of lightly sweetened dough, fried in olive oil (the only oil), soaked in a honey-rosewater (or other liquid) and topped with a variety of spices and nuts, as the award for the first Olympiad (776 bce). Every culture had a fritter, which are what doughnuts are, and one can find myth and legend surrounding even the modern doughnut. While I was researching the Slavic Goddesses - Pertcha/Bertcha/Bertha, in particular. I found evidence of a practice by a "cult" of worshippers of Pertcha. Who believed that plying the goddess with various treats, dusted with a sugary "snow" to represent Her season, would stave off her vengeful wanderings. One such treat was a kind of fried "fruitcake" (ovens being in short supply) called Oliebollen. Oliebollen is made with dried fruit and spices mixed in a sweet yeast dough (batter) and fried in large quantities. It is then stacked into pyramidical mounds and dusted with fine sugar (modern use - powdered sugar).

Here is a recipe I use. It is not from medieval sources (the middle-class and the poor seldom wrote recipes down), but I did adapt it to what dried fruits may have been available. Don't let this limit you – cranberries and pecans would possibly taste awesome in oiliebollen.

Oliebollen


- 💲 1 can sweetened condensed milk +enough warm water to make 2 cups
- § 1 package active dry yeast
- \$ 2 cups All-Purpose flour
- ⑤ About 1½-2 cups finely chopped dried fruit (I usually use dried figs, apples, golden raisins and apricots) or substitute about ½ cup of applesauce for some of the dried fruit
- So The zest of a lemon and an orange
- S Juice of 1/2 lemon
- ® Pinch salt
- § 4 cups of vegetable oil
- S Confectioner's sugar

Bloom the yeast in ½ cup of the warm milk. Combine the flour and remaining milk with the yeast mixture to make a soft dough. Cove4r and let stand in a warm place for 1-2 hours. Stir down the dough and add the zest, salt, and fruit. Heat oil to 360° F. Drop tablespoonfuls of the dough into the hot oil and fry until golden brown. You will have to turn them several times. Remove with a slotted spoon (I use a spider) and drain on absorbent paper. Sprinkle with confectioner's sugar and serve hot or cold.

Legendary Yule Characters

- 1) Gryla: An Icelandic Troll, hungry for the flesh of disobedient children. A year round cannibal, but children are well seasoned this time of year...
- 2) Perchta: Once revered as a goddess in the Northern Alps, Perchta the bright one visits homes during Midwinter with silver coins for the good, and disembowelment for the naughty.
- 3) La Befana: An Italian witch who visits homes on Epiphany Eve. Good children get candy. Bad children get coal. Nosy people get a thump from the broom.
- 4) Jólakötturinn/Yule Cat: A huge black cat, Gryla's pet. Anyone not getting a present of new clothes is his presents.
- 5) Saint Nick: Keeper of dubious company.
- 6) The Krampus: Central European companion of Saint Nicholas. Arrives on Dec 5 to deliver coal, birch branch swats, and express rides to Hell for naughty children.
- 7) Mari Lwyd: A Welsh spirit that travels door to door with her party during the winter and sings for entrance. Resistors must engage in pwnco with the Mari Lwyd. Those that run out of verses must treat the Mari Lwyd to food and drink.
- 8) Hurðaskellir/Door Slammer: One of the 13 Icelandic Yule Lads. Son of Gryla. Arrives on Dec 18, stays around until Dec 31, and slams doors to keep people awake.
- 9) Gáttaþefur/Door Sniffer: One of the 13 Icelandic Yule Lads. Son of Gryla. Arrives on Dec 22, stays around until Jan 4, and uses his large nose to sniff doors in search of laufabrauð.
- 10) Belsnickel: German companion of Saint Nicholas. A lone operator, arriving in the weeks leading up to Christmas. Gives sweets to good children, and lashes with a switch whether naughty or nice.
- 11) Tomte: Scandinavian guardian spirit. Guards all members of a household, helps with chores, and delivers presents in winter. Unless disrespected, when he reveals a dark and mischievous side.
