With this in mind, I plan to do a deep dive. We have a folder full of letters sent to Master Gavin that shed light on the founding of the Barony. Many are barely legible, so I plan to transcribe them. Slowly, over time. Our Baronial web minister, who has been hard at work getting the new and improved Baronial website ready for debut, will be adding a Baronial History

page where we will put the transcriptions and as much other info about Baronial history as we can.

This is where I ask for your help: we need pictures, stories, event flyers, etc. from the early days of the Barony. Many things have already been sent and more is being worked on. To everyone who is venturing in the attic and poring over old dusty documents: I can't thank you enough!

The following is the first installment of my presentation on Baronial History. I used Master Gavin's collected letters for most of the information in this, so some things may not be precisely correct. The founding of the Principality of Atlantia has two different start dates in the letters, for example. I assume that the first date refers to recognition as an incipient group and the second is the official founding.

I plan to have the next installment ready for the August newsletter. For those of you who were there: please do not hesitate to make me aware of errors and share information I didn't previously have. I am going to wait a week or so before sending this to Virtual Atlantia in anticipation of corrections or additions.

I hope this missive finds you all well and coping. Until we can meet again, My best regards.

The Barony of Nottingham Coill: Forty Years Strong

Part I: The Founding

Once upon a time in a distant corner of the Kingdom of the East, there was a man who heard about the Dream. He wrote letters far and wide asking how he could be a part of that Dream. This man became known as Gavin Reynes; the titles of Baron and Master came later. In the beginning he was just Dr. Dale O. Rains, a mild-mannered Theatre professor at Presbyterian College in Clinton, SC.

I don't know how Dr. Rains first found out about the SCA (if anyone does please inform me and I will update this), but there was no SCA presence in South Carolina when he first started reaching out for information sometime in 1976. Master Gavin saved all his correspondence, and through this, we know that he did not have an easy time of finding the information he needed to start a chapter in South Carolina. We will never know how many letters he sent out, but the first person to write him back was Baroness Margarethe the Dog from the Barony of South Downs in the then Principality of Meridies, Kingdom of Atenveldt. Over the course of several handwritten letters starting in October of 1976, she graciously answered as many of his questions that she could and sent him a membership form, a somewhat outdated guide to setting up a group and a copy of the "Notus"- her kingdom's unofficial newsletter. From the text of her letters, it is clear that Gavin had not yet been to an event and she urged him to do so before setting up a group. To that end, she sent him a list of upcoming events.

This is a good point at which to stop and talk about what the SCA looked like in the United States in 1976. There were only four Kingdoms: The West, The Middle, Atenveldt and The East. At this time, South Carolina was part of the

East Kingdom. The Principality of Atlantia was just being formed, consisting of Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina and South Carolina.

Baroness Margarethe put Gavin in touch with Lord Brian Maolcaoin, Seneschal of the (then) Shire of Windmaster's Hill, who promptly wrote him to offer his assistance. He gave him the contact info for the Seneschal of the new Principality of Atlantia. He also put Gavin in touch with Gwyneth Duncan, the Seneschal of the Raleigh-Chapel Hill Group (Lord Maolcaoin does not name this group specifically).

In December of 1976, William de Montegilt, Seneschal of the East Kingdom wrote Gavin with the following news. "A meeting of the Curia Regis was held in Boston this past weekend. The Curia approves your request to form a group in South Carolina. In fact, you get the whole state! You are the Seneschal-designate of the incipient branch forming in the state of South Carolina. The Society's designation of the form of branch that you should organize is a Shire. You will need to choose a name and file new branch forms." He went on to explain some about the forms and reporting requirements, and let Gavin know that he had added him to the mailing list to receive the Acorn, the newsletter of the Principality of Atlantia.

And then it was official! Miraculously, despite having to scrounge for information and communicate through snail mail, the new Shire of Nottingham Coill was off the ground in 1977. Lord Maolcaoin continued to be a font of information for Gavin. Other good gentles wrote to offer information on their areas of expertise and Gavin found others in South Carolina who were as interested as he. A letter from Lady Mageara Allesandra, Seneschal of Tear-Sea's Shore in January of 1977 made it clear that Gavin had found like-minded people on the coast.

By A.S. XIV (1980) the Shire of Nottingham Coill was thriving, with several cantons: Falcon Cree, Cyddylaine Downs (spelling changed later), Fnaedhom

and Tear Sea's Shore. Hidden Mountain was also part of the Shire of Nottingham Coill, though opinions differ as whether it was officially a Canton of the Shire or not. In any case, Hidden Mountain was given its' independence with Shire status at the same event in which Nottingham Coill became a Barony.

Gavin was led to believe that it would be a while before Nottingham Coill qualified for the status of Barony, but Queen Embla of the Kingdom of the East (remember- Atlantia is still a principality at this date) had decided to surprise him. To this end she conspired with Giles of Griffin Hill, the Seneschal of the Shire of Nottingham Coill at the time, and (now) Baron William de Montegilt to make all the arrangements behind his back. On the morning of Twelfth Night the scroll, petition and Sacred Soil were assembled, and Lord Gavin was completely unaware. Royal Court was held after feast and Lord Gavin and his other officers were called into court. Queen Embla then declared the Shire of Nottingham Coill to be the Barony of Nottingham Coill and Gavin was asked to swear fealty to the East Crowns. The sod which the queen had requested from the Shire was presented to the new Baron, symbolizing the giving of territory.

Thus, was the Barony of Nottingham Coill born, on 12 January, A.S. XIV, at Principality Twelfth Night held by the Guardians of the Sacred Stone (who would later become the core of the Barony of Sacred Stone) and Gavin became the first Baron of these lands. Vivats!

Baronial General & Financial Policy Review

Unto the populace of the Barony of Nottingham Hill Coill, greetings from your Baronial Seneschal.

Their Excellencies and I have done a review of the Baronial General and Financial Policies, and have determined that there are a few changes that need to be made.

I am posting the proposed changes for the populace to look over, and make any comment they wish. On Saturday, July 11 at 4:00 PM, there will be a virtual online Baronial Populace meeting to discuss these changes and vote on making them a permanent part of the General and Financial Policies. If you have any questions or comments, please feel communicate them to Their Excellencies and myself in advance of the meeting, if possible.

Please note, there have been some minor revisions since the March Quill based on feedback from some members of the populace as well as the Kingdom Exchequer.

Financial Policy for the Barony of Nottingham Hill Coill

Section 1.3

Currently Reads

“This document shall be reviewed annually at the Baronial Meeting at the Baronial Birthday event”

Proposed Change

“This document shall be reviewed annually at an event within the Barony”

Reasoning

This removes the restriction of reviewing at a specific event, and gives a little leeway to when the Financial Policy can be reviewed. Baronial Birthday is a

very busy and hectic day for Their Excellencies, so this will give a little breathing room.

Section 2.2

Currently Reads

“The Exchequer shall, upon request, provide access to the Barony’s financial reports and books to any member of the Barony and shall publish the annual Doomsday Report in the February issue of the Baronial Newsletter”

Proposed Change

“The Exchequer shall, upon request, provide access to the Barony’s financial reports and books to any member of the Barony. The Comparative Balance Statement and Income Statement shall be published in the February issue of the Baronial Newsletter”

Reasoning

This is an area that we have not been compliant in for several years, and needs to be addressed. There really is no need for the entire Doomsday report to be published, but the SCA Financial Policy does state:

“Financial statements (consisting of the Comparative Balance Statement and the Income Statement) must be made available to the public at least annually, whether published in a newsletter or distributed to the membership in some other form.” - SCA Financial Policy (Approved 8/27/2019), Section I, part C.

Therefore, we are proposing that the text be changed from Doomsday Report to a simple Comparative Balance Statement and Income Statement.

Section 3.6

Currently Reads

“The Financial Committee shall report all of its activity to the populace at the next scheduled Baronial meeting and in the Baronial newsletter”

Proposed Change

“The Financial Committee shall report all of its activity to the populace at the next scheduled Baronial Meeting, and will make that information available to anyone who submits a request in writing.”

Reasoning

The report can be done verbally at a meeting, but will also be available in writing to anyone who requests it.

Section 4.1.1

Currently Reads

“The Event Steward shall present a proposed budget for an event to the Financial Committee for review and approval at least six (6) months before the date of the event. The Financial Committee may choose to reduce this six (6) month schedule under extenuating circumstances, such as a request from the Crown or an event being small enough in scope that six (6) months’ lead time is not required. A final itemized budget shall be presented not later than ninety (90) days before the start of the event.”

Proposed Change

“The Event Steward shall present a proposed budget for an event, sponsored or underwritten by the Barony, to the Financial Committee for review and approval at least six (6) months before the date of the event. The Financial Committee may choose to reduce this six (6) month schedule under extenuating circumstances, such as a request from the Crown or an event being small enough in scope that six (6) months’ lead time is not required. A final itemized budget shall be presented not later than sixty (60) days before the start of the event.”

Reasoning

Clarification that this is only for events run by the Barony, not the Cantons, and 60 days should be sufficient time without being overly long or short.

Section 4.2.1

Currently Reads

“All checks shall be photocopied and deposited in a timely manner, within not more than two (2) weeks of receipt.”

Proposed Change

“All checks shall be photocopied, scanned, or photographed, and deposited in a timely manner, within not more than two (2) weeks of receipt.”

Reasoning

Adding additional methods, since much is digital these days.

Section 4.2.3

Currently Reads

“All event proceeds shall be deposited within five (5) days after the conclusion of the event.”

Proposed Change

“All event proceeds shall be deposited within seven (7) days after the conclusion of the event.”

Reasoning

This gives a little leeway to allow for things such as travel, vacations, or holidays messing with scheduling.

**This proposed change has been struck down, as Kingdom Policy requires 5 days, and we cannot have a less lenient policy than the Kingdom. **

Section 5.1.2

Currently Reads

“Requests for reimbursement of event-related expenditures must be submitted within five (5) days of the close of the event and must have the approval of the Event Steward.”

Proposed Change

“Requests for reimbursement of event-related expenditures must be submitted within seven (7) days of the close of the event and must have the approval of the Event Steward.”

Reasoning

This gives a little leeway to allow for things such as travel, vacations, or holidays messing with scheduling.

These changes have been vetted and approved (with some refinement to the original intended changes) by Their Excellencies of Nottingham Coill, the Kingdom Exchequer, and myself.

Again, if you have commentary, questions, suggestions of additional changes, etc., please contact Their Excellencies and myself.

From the north, south or west: Take your best route to I-77's exit 82 which is in Jonesville, North Carolina. Take exit 82 and turn east at the end of the exit ramp. (Turn left if coming from the north, turn right if coming from the south.) Proceed 0.4 miles past the roundabout and, at the top of the first hill, turn right onto Messick Rd. Go to the end of Messick Rd, (1.7 miles) and turn left on Center Road. Follow Center Road for 5.8 miles to reach Elchenburg Castle Farm on your right. Proceed to gate, troll in and enjoy your adventure! From the east: Take Highway 421 toward Boone and Yadkinville. (This road exits from I-40 on the west side of Winston-Salem near the intersection of Business I-40 and Bypass I-40.) Continue on 421 past the Yadkinville/Highway 601 exit, to the Reavis Road exit.
