Lucien and Brig, Baron and Baroness HAPPY BIRTHDAY SCA! As of May 1, we are in Anno Societatis (A.S.) 51 . . . and still going strong.

This month's edition of The Quill is brought to you by the various officers of our marvelous barony. Most of you have at least a passing idea of who does what to keep our chapters running. But do you really know what it takes to be an Exchequer, Chronicler, Chatelain, or Seneschal, just to name a few? I can't speak about all these offices, but I can offer some insights about being a Seneschal.

In plain English, the Seneschal is the chapter president. The Baron and Baroness are the ceremonial representatives of the King and Queen. But the Seneschal is the administrative and legal representative. That's why the Seneschal must be an SCA member and of legal age: we have to be able to sign contracts or checks, and be legally responsible for what goes on in our chapter. The Seneschal is one of two mandatory positions in a chapter; the Exchequer is the other one. There also must be a third officer (Herald, Marshal, or Minister of Arts & Sciences), but these two are required.

What does it take to be an effective Seneschal? (And no, I'm not claiming to hold any or all of these qualities. Nor do I anticipate that each Seneschal will hold all of these qualities. But I can dream, can't I?)

-- You should be organized: regardless of whether you're the canton, baronial, or kingdom seneschal, there WILL be paperwork and email. You need to be able to keep track of what's going on in your group and (if you're the Baronial Seneschal) among the cantons in your group. Whether it's hardcopy paperwork or electronic messages, you must be able to store and retrieve this information when needed. And you also have to be able to submit reports accurately and on time.

-- You must be accessible: by mail, electronic means, and telephone. When issues or questions arise, people must be able to reach you. Yes, we all have 'real lives' that get in the way of spending as much time as we'd like in the Middle Ages, and sometimes we have to be off-

line. But if there is a real need, you or a designated deputy must be there to do what's needed.

-- You should have an open mind: genuinely willing to listen to differing opinions and giving them fair consideration. It's quite possible that someone else has a valid point of view, even if it doesn't agree with your own. And maybe someone else has an idea or piece of information that you haven't thought of yet. Learn from the people you're working with.

-- You must have a closed mouth: many times you'll become privy to information that is not for public dissemination, or perhaps not at that time. Maybe someone is being considered for an award and your opinion has been sought. You wouldn't want to spoil the surprise by letting the proverbial cat out of the bag. And if there's an individual causing difficulties in your chapter, your Baron and Baroness or your next-level officer (e.g. Baronial or Kingdom Seneschal) may bring you into discussions. Sharing what you've been told could be extremely hurtful to other people, and brand you as a gossip or untrustworthy person. Definitely not a good thing.

-- You should be able to lead a meeting competently and firmly, without being dictatorial. Most meetings I've attended have been fairly low-key: a line-by-line knowledge of Robert's Rules of Order is not at all necessary. But you should be able to recognize when a discussion is getting off track and either get it back on track or bring it to a close.

-- You should support the SCA both at meetings and events as well as outside them. It does not speak well for you or the organization if you're all smiles and glad-handing when you're in garb but talking ill of your chapter (or the barony or kingdom or SCA as a whole) when you're away from an event. You may just have soured a prospective newcomer who was considering joining us.

-- You should be able to encourage others to step up and try an office. Every one of us came into the SCA without ever having done so. Yes, you may have been a treasurer or president for an organization in the modern world. But the world of the SCA is a bit different. We learned from others; now it's up to us to help others to learn. Sooner or

later we're going to want to either move up or step back, and we can't do so without someone else to take our place. Perhaps take on a person as a deputy, to help him or her get more experience before committing to the full job.

-- You should recognize talent and potential in others and encourage it. This is an extension of the previous item, but it includes spotting qualities that the others might not even have given themselves credit for. And it may mean suggesting that they try their hands at being an Exchequer or Marshal or something other than being the Seneschal.

-- Have fun! And realize that serving as a Seneschal will help you develop skills that absolutely will carry over into the modern world . . . and it looks great on a resume'.

To wrap up this month's column, Vivant to those of our barony who received awards and recognitions recently. At Gulf Wars XXV, Lord Diederich von Basel received the barony's Order of the Sword Knot, Lady Birna Isleifsdottir received the Baron's Award of Excellence, and Count Randal Sinclair Hawkins received the King's Award of Excellence. At Tourney of the Dragon, Lady Iollann of Glencairn received a rare doubleheader: both the Coral Branch AND the Opal from His Majesty Dietrich. Lady Marie Helene of the New Forest received an Award of the Fountain for her cooking. Lord Wilhelm Leopard der Schwarze received a Grant of Arms primarily for his long-standing work as a Marshal. Lady Birna Isleifsdottir and Lord Dreux d'Anjou both received a Silver Nautilus for their exceptional work in the Arts & Sciences. There were other baronial awards bestowed at Tourney of the Dragon, but they have not yet been posted to Atlantia's Order of Precedence page. So I'll report on them next month.

Baronial knight's marshal is a great, easy going office and if there is a marshal of any discipline that would want to be a deputy of this office, I would be more than happy to accept. As a final thought, I would like to remind the populace that you do not need to be an armored marshal to be a group's knight's marshal (or a deputy of one). Any discipline is welcome.
