A Thrifty Person's Tablet Weaving Loom

My first introduction to tablet weaving was at a Brockore Abbey Canton meeting. Sharla Hobbs brought her lovely copper tubing loom that she had made for herself (or maybe Nolan made it, not too sure, in hindsight). I was fascinated with the idea of tablet weaving and wanted to learn the art for myself. Another Canton member, Diana Goldie, offered to teach me the basics but I needed a loom.

The internet can be a wonderful thing. With a few typed phrases and a few clicks, I had located the basic instructions for the construction of a copper tubing loom. So off to a large local hardware store I went to buy my supplies. I went past the PVC pipe on my way to the copper tubing section. After reaching the copper section, my inherited thriftiness (I come from a long, long line of cheap people) I gasped at the prices. While pondering the different pieces I would need to construct a basic loom, my eyes were drawn back to the PVC pipe. I thought "hmm, why copper, why not plastic?"

I estimated that the copper tubing would cost about \$45+ for the needed tubing and assorted joints, but the PVC was a whopping \$11. So I happily went home with two 5 foot pieces of 1-inch pipe, two 1-inch T's and six 1-inch elbows. I cannot remember the exact price of the two 1-foot-long pieces of 1/2 inch thread-all and four nuts I purchased but it would have been the same for the copper loom.

After I made my basic loom, I was thrilled because it was sturdy, light weight and very portable because I did not need to glue the pieces together. I can break it down into sections of PVC and slide it into a bag when not in use. After weaving a few pieces, I bought another piece of PVC to allow me to make shorter and longer frame pieces to accommodate the different lengths I wanted to weave.

A side note - I used tablets/cards cut from a variety of cereal and cracker boxes for my starter pieces. They work very well and last a long time.
