From the Seneschal's Pen...

Another War has come and gone: five days of feasting, fighting, friendship, and occasional (?) foolery. War was declared, sides were chosen, the fighting was fierce, and at the end we went home tired, but with new or reinforced friendships, secure in the knowledge that we can do it all over again next year. Would that we could wage modern wars so briskly and with such good feelings at the end.

Much of what I normally would cover in this column is being addressed elsewhere in this issue:

-- Notes from the brief baronial meeting held at War of the Wings, primarily discussing the change of rotation assignments for filling up The Quill

-- The need for a new webminister, plus the necessary qualities and qualifications

-- A HUGE list of baronial residents who have received awards in the past few months.

November typically is a quiet time in Nottinghill Coill. But there are two significant 'events' occurring in December. The first, actually, is Unevent: socalled because it is the only gathering on the kingdom calendar held entirely in modern clothing, with no feast, no fighting, nor anything else typically associated with an SCA event. This is the one time of the year when each of the people holding offices at any level throughout Nottinghill Coill and Atlantia have the opportunity to meet their respective Kingdom Officers as well as those who hold the same office as you but who may live at the opposite corners of Atlantia. Why is this important? Everyone in that office gets to hear the same information from the same source at the same time - unlike the old game of 'Telephone', where a message is apt to get quite garbled between the sender and the receiver. You can ask questions of your eastern, western, and northern counterparts, and find out how they may have handled situations you're facing down here. And most Kingdom Officers (sometimes referred to, tongue-in-cheek, as GOOfS [Great Officers Of State] also hold Office Hours after the main meeting. This is your time to talk, one-on-one with that Officer, about issues and concerns that you may not have wanted to bring up within the entire group. As always, Unevent is held on the first Saturday in December. This year the Barony of Dun Carraig is the host, on December 2, 2017. The gathering will be held at North Point High School, in Waldorf MD. Here's a link to the Un-Event flyer: <u>http://atlantia.sca.org/137-events/170-event-info?event_id=ebd8a9fe</u> A schedule of the various Office and Order meetings will be posted shortly before the event. If you are an Officer of the canton or barony, you are expected to attend OR send a designated deputy in your place.

This is an excellent time for carpooling: you don't have to pack any garb, feastware, armor, or canvas. So, you'll have plenty of room to bring some fellow officers with you and share the travel costs. At a minimum, I will be attending the Seneschals' meeting, and (depending on the scheduling) likely the Seneschals / Exchequers meeting as well. I hereby offer to take notes and share them with all the canton seneschals. Even if I attend the combined Seneschals / Exchequers meeting, there are many items discussed in the Exchequers-only meeting which are not usually covered in the combined meeting. Make sure that you have a way of getting the notes.

In the January issue of The Quill I expect to see a write-up from each of the offices. This is the only way we can keep the entire barony aware of issues and changes that affect them. Start reaching out now to ensure that you get the necessary information, if you can't attend Unevent.

The second event is one that's very special to the Barony and, indeed, to the Kingdom. It is the only 100% philanthropic event held in Atlantia during the year: Yule Toy Tourney. This year's dates are December 8-10. Here's a link to the Facebook page (the flyer on the kingdom calendar page is unavailable as I write this):

The large contingent of Wandering Turnip Farmers were welcomed to the camp and invited to share in the potluck feast. They had decided to ally themselves with us for the War, in return for our hospitality. They agreed that there was much truth to our baronial motto: We Will Feed You into Submission.

Master Gavin Reynes, our Founding Baron and present Baronial Webminister, has indicated his desire to step down as soon as a successor can be found. Information about the qualities and qualifications needed for a successor will be shared elsewhere in this newsletter. Anyone who wishes to be considered for the post should send me (the Baronial Seneschal) an email (bwahaha -atspiritcom -dot- net) not later than Friday 17 November 2017.

Several years ago, a decision was made and agreed to by the then-canton seneschals to spread out primary responsibility for submitting content to The Quill (the baronial newsletter). Overall this has worked fairly well, but the rotation schedule was a bit confusing as to whose turn it was when. I proposed that, starting with submittals for the December issue, the rotation will be in alphabetic order by canton name. Responsibility for the sixth month of each half-year cycle will fall to the Baronial Officers and Baronial Guilds. No objections were raised, so the schedule henceforth will be as follows:

- December issue (submittals due in November): Brockore Abbey. (Note: it would have been Brockore Abbey's turn even without this change.)
- January issue (submittals due in December): Cyddlan Downs
- February Issue (submittals due in January): Falcon Cree

- March issue (submittals due in February): Ritterwald
- April issue (submittals due in March): St. Georges
- May issue (submittals due in April): Baronial Officers and Baronial Guilds
- June issue (submittals due in May): the cycle begins again with Brockore Abbey
- July (submittals due in June): Cyddlan Downs
- August (submittals due in July): Falcon Cree
- September (submittals due in August): Ritterwald
- October (submittals due in September): St. Georges
- November (submittals due in October): Baronial Officers and Baronial Guilds

No further matters were brought up, the meeting was concluded, and everyone resumed their enjoyment of the feast.

Qualities and Qualifications

1. A love for the Barony of Nottinghill Coill.

2. An ability to enjoy the job. This is the most important one. If a webminister cannot enjoy building and maintaining the website, he/she will easily allow the website to deteriorate.

3. A good sense of the aesthetic. This is the second most important one. There are too many ugly websites in this world.

The Praetorian Guard By: Dominus Maximus



In Ancient Rome, Praetorian Guard was a unit of the Imperial Roman Army formed from elite soldiers initially recruited in Italia. These units originated from a small group of men around the republican magistrates, the praetors, and those around legionary camps where the legion's command element was garrisoned during campaigns. After defeating Legatus Antonius, the new and first Emperor, Augustus Caesar, formalized the Praetorian Guard. There were probably nine cohorts comprised of around 500 men each, just as with the regular legions. Before 2 BC (751 AUC) each individual cohort was led by a tribune of equestrian rank. Afterwards, Augustus created two posts for overall command of the guard, these 2 men were called Praetorian Prefects. The Emperor

Tiberius further consolidated the Praetorian Guard by constructing the great Praetorian Camp in Rome. This act so impressed the Guard, that the scorpion became a common symbol on Praetorian shields, armor, etc. (Tiberius' birth sign was Scorpio). The primary role of the Praetorians was to act as a bodyguard to the Emperor and serve as a police force in the city. During the Battle of the Milvian Bridge (October 28 312 AD), the Praetorian Guard, part of the Army of Maxentius (proclaimed by the Praetorians), was almost annihilated, later Constantine the Great preferred to dissolve the Praetorian Guard after his accession to power beginning 313 AD (1066 AUC).

In order not to alienate the population of Rome, while conserving Republican civilian traditions, the Praetorians did not wear their armor while in the heart of the city. Instead they often wore a formal toga, which distinguished them from civilians but remained in a respectable civilian attire, the mark of a Roman citizen. Augustus, conscious of risking the only military force present in the city, often avoided concentrating them and imposed this dress code. While campaigning, the Praetorians were the equal in every way to any formation in the Roman army. They first saw action under Tiberius. He was faced with mutinies among both the Rhine and Pannonian legions. According to Tacitus, the Pannonian forces were dealt with by Tiberius' son Drusus, accompanied by two Praetorian cohorts, the Praetorian cavalry and some of the German bodyguard. The German mutiny was put down by Tiberius' nephew and adopted son

Germanicus, his intended heir, who then led the legions and detachments of the Guard in an invasion of Germany over the next two years.

Praetorians seen on Trajan's Column appear with the standard legionary rectangular scuta, but other sculptures depict them with the oval Republican era variety. Some historians believe the oval shield was relegated as parade equipment, a symbol of Rome's glorious past. Yet, such shields were used for years by the legions. The picture at the beginning of this article, Fragment of the



Arc de Triomphe 51-52 AD, depicts the Guard with oval shields. In film and toys Praetorians are often depicted with blue shields and black/dark colored uniforms. Yet, there is no direct evidence to for this. Shield blazons on a relief housed in the Louvre are thought to be Praetorian. They include moon and star shapes, which has lead many artists to assume the shield was painted black or blue (to represent the night sky). Tacitus' description of the 69 AD battle of Cremona implies that Praetorian shield was all that distinguished his appearance from a legionar

Award Writing Recommendations

Pssst. It is easier than you think!

Casual or formal? Modern speech pattern or writing forsooth? Handwritten? Emailed? Online program? Presented in person? By the time you can think of all the questions you might consider, you could be done! If writing recommendations is scary for you, these 6 steps (yep, only 6 main steps!) may help you decide who is worthy and help you get those good gentles the recognition they deserve.

Whom?

This one is both the easiest of the steps and the hardest: Awareness. If you can attend many events, you see more people often. You start to recognize who is fighting in the list, that gentle at Gate, and that family who goes together to pick up trash around the site. You see more; you can become familiar and oft reporting eyes to both Crown and Baronage.

If you can only attend one or two events, you are still the eyes and the ears of our Crown and your Baronage. You can be aware of those quiet moments, that particular act, those fantastic attitudes because they make more impact for you.

Do you play mainly in your local group, household or guild? Great! Tell us about the people there through recommendations! No matter how much you play or where, it can be easy to take things for granted or assume others have written in about someone.

Please do not assume. What is important to you and your SCA experience may not be a priority to someone else. You have to make a commitment to keep your ears open and your vision fresh. Attend every event and local group meeting with a goal:

- 1. I will find one person I will recommend to Crown and Baronage.
- 2. Don't worry about which award or honor yet, just the "who."

You will want to add a small notebook or index cards to your personal portability device (pouch, basket, crusader's bag) as well as a pen. Introduce yourself to the object of your possible recommendation or get their name from a friend. Don't forget to use them!

An Important note – if someone's actions catch your eye, do not assume they catch the eye of everyone nor that anyone else recommended them for honor. This is why some people only receive an Award of Arms after 20 years of continuous service. Everyone assumed they had one and no one took a moment to check.

Why?

This step requires a personal rating system. Do you send a recommendation for one act or a collection of them? Both? No answer is wrong, but having a solution that you can use is essential. If a person serves a feast, is that an act worthy of recommendation? If that person is always serving feast, is that when you take notice? What of the fighter who makes an incredible shot or takes 2nd in a bout that had you standing and cheering due to prowess and chivalry? Or is it the fighter who makes every practice who will get your notice? Do you write for both? What of the artist making garb? Do you write of their first piece of o-my-gawd garb or of the time spent in learning to make o-mygawd garb? For the painter whose name is read time and time again from the back of scrolls or when their artwork becomes magnificent because of all the work they put into their craft? That card where you noted a person's name or description so that you could track them down should also contain a few words about why they caught your eye. Always at troll. Does she spend all her events there? Redhead. Green Kit. Hangs with Bordervale fighters. Amazing precision in the list. Court. Counted name read 4 times for calligraphy. Look them up.

More whys?

Keep track of whom you write recommendations for and who you are still on the fence about. If you have five notes to yourself for one person, maybe they do deserve your recommendation writing time. Or if you have been writing for them over the years, is it time to ask a circle to pay attention to them as well? **Where**?

Whatever you are writing a recommendation for or if there are multiple examples of a person doing a thing, try to keep track of where it happened. If you have that information, include it in your recommendations.

Always at troll. Does she spend all her events there? Yule, BB, Crown, Art/sci Redhead. Green Kit. Hangs with Bordervale fighters. Amazing precision in the list. NCBB, HMBB, Yule Court. Counted name read 4 times for calligraphy. Look them up.Meridies Court. Was that G? 2 scrolls? Largesse? NCBB Court. 5 this time, illum & writing. More Skills.

The Actual How of Recommendations

Maybe you choose Wednesday after all events. Perhaps you prefer the last Wednesday of the month. It is up to you when you do it, just keep it and make it a habit. Once the day and frequency you have chosen, gather up your notes and look at the awards and honors available. Decide whom you are going to recommend the person to. Your Barony? Their Barony? Crown? Everyone (and why not?)?

A person does not have to be a member of a Barony to receive a Baronial award or recognition. In fact, how cool would it be to receive an honor from another Barony for something done in their lands? A person does not need to be a member of a Barony or Kingdom to write for a member of the Barony or Kingdom. In fact, how amazing would it be to get something because someone outside your group noticed? Recommendations for Kingdoms can be a little tricky, but it is important to know, especially for those near the borderlands. Write BOTH Crowns. Let them know which kingdom the good gentle resides in. Tell each why you are recommending the gentle involved, that you supported Order of the Hobbit's Foot in Kingdom A and Award of the Traveler's Path in Kingdom B. Always gently ask the Crown of both kingdoms to allow the award go forth. Then allow the Crowns to do their thing. It is polite for one Sovereign to permit another Sovereign to present an honor.

More How

You have decided whom to write, now pick what you are writing for. Most Kingdoms and local groups have their list of Awards online. Look them over while comparing your person's Order of Precedence. If you decide to recommend for entry service, and OP shows that person already has it, start looking at the intermediate service awards.

By the way, use whatever form of speech you are comfortable with (casual, formal, modern, medieval). You just want to make sure that you have:

- 1. Given all the facts in and
- 2. You respect the time of the reader.

That fighter you noted, you think they deserve a high merit award, but find they have not received an entry level honor. Start at the beginning of awards and look for other opportunities to write again. That scribe? Dang, they just got a court barony. Is it time to write for Laurel notice or do you need to collect more information?

These steps will help you get started. Don't forget to rely on your local herald for help in the actual filing process or ask a friend how they do it. It can be confusing, but it is the most beautiful feeling when you see a worthy receive an award in court, and you hear your words coming from the Baronage or Crown.
