## From the Seneschal's Pen

Pennsic is over for another year, and so starts the long wait until next year's Great War. Much like a child marks time from one holiday or birthday to the next, we do the same in the SCA: how many weeks until Pennsic, War of the Wings, Yule Toy Tourney, Baronial Birthday, Ymir, fill in the blank? For us, though, there's always another reason to gather and celebrate, waiting right around the corner. Saddened by the end of Pennsic and the loss of such fighting? Southern War Practice is imminent, with War of the Wings close on its heels. Miss all the exquisite Arts & Sciences that were displayed? Get your entries started now (if you haven't done so already) for WoW or even next year's Kingdom Arts & Sciences Festival. And there ALWAYS are opportunities to serve. This year, again, Security at War of the Wings is being overseen by our own Lord Draco of Brockore. And he can use all the help you're willing to provide. Last year, he ended up handling almost 2/3 of all the shifts himself, when numerous people for numerous reasons failed to show up.

The SCA is not a Renaissance Festival, where you pay money to watch other people having fun, munch on a turkey leg, and go home. The only reason that the SCA works is that it's completely participatory: there are no uninvolved bystanders. Don't like to be outdoors in the weather? Help out with feast preparation indoors, and get an advance taste of all the deliciousness. Can't stand for very long? Become an Mol (Minister of the List), which guarantees you a front-row seat at every tournament. Like to work out of the public eye, and have a talent at drawing/painting or writing? Become a scribe and do virtually all of your work at home as time is available. Are you a nightowl? Volunteer for a night security shift. You'll even likely get to do your job from the comfort of a golf cart. Do you enjoy meeting people? If you prefer to sit down, help out at Troll / the Gate / the Tollner's station: you'll get to greet

everyone. If you'd rather be outdoors and on your feet, pitch in with waterbearing. You will be more appreciated than you ever imagined.

And these are just event-related items. There are plenty of tasks that need doing in between events. If you have a talent for organization, consider working with Atlantia's University staff or the staff of a Collegium, or maybe even your group's seneschal. Have a head for numbers? An Exchequer is one of the only two mandatory offices for each chapter. Now that nearly every office's forms and reports are electronic, completing them is not nearly so daunting as they once might have seemed. Still feeling intimidated? Offer to help as a deputy to one of the officers, either in your canton or at the baronial level. That's a great way to decide if you want to move up, eventually, to become the actual office-holder. Do you feel comfortable with the language of the Internet and its databases? Groups at many levels can use the help of either a web minister or someone who can make their websites even better. And you need not get stuck in one office if you feel that you'd prefer a change.

In short, no matter where your talents lie, or the degree of your abilities, there's a position (or Several!) in the Society that would benefit from your participation.

Along those lines, Lady Janna of Falcon Cree is stepping down as Baronial Exchequer, and Lady Albree de Greene is succeeding her. This means that the position of Deputy Baronial Exchequer now is open, if anyone is interested in considering it. Also, Lord Olaf Stammkopf is leaving the Baronial Financial Committee and Lord Eamonn mac Rioghbhardan is succeeding him. Thanks to each of these people for their service, past, present, and future!

Normally I wrap up each month's column with a 'Vivant' to those of our barony who received awards and recognitions recently. However - once again there's nothing to post! So, you'll just have to wait until the next issue to catch up on all the recognitions that have been given to our barony's members.

One of the saddest things I hear way too often is 'but I thought he/she already had that award (or 'was a member of that Order'.)' ## A Barony's Largesse: Gifts for Giving...

Once upon a reign, I met a Queen who lived her persona so well that immediately after stepping down from the throne, she stepped up to serve high table because that is what a woman of her time and noble station would have done as Largesse—served the Crown and their quests by her own hand.

The Crown chooses the Baronage to speak for them. But Our Baronage is also Our Voice to the Kingdom and beyond.

When asked, a landed Baronage in another land once told me their favorite largesse was anything that included the words, "thank you" in whatever form. These gifts they could give out all day long and could still need more to show appreciation to newcomers all the way through to their Lieges.

Our Baron and Our Baroness are our representatives of hospitality and well-wishing, of taxes and celebration. Their actions and words, their gifts speak for us.

Besides, largesse is a fun way to art! You can make one of the things or many of the things—your choice!

Largesse can be jewelry, embroidery and basically every handicraft that had a start in the medieval world. You can give a promissory offering of food stuffs for a hospitality table or a chit to play music during a time of their choosing.

There is a myth that Largesse must be period, said my Scadian mentor. "Forgot something" bags with a toothbrush, paste, shampoo and lotion might be modern, but you would smile if you had forgotten your toothbrush and there was one for you.

Other ideas are award medallions, scarves, scroll blanks and small containers of cloth or wood to hold gifts.

A Court Baron who now lives only in memory made it his mission to provide feast gear for those who had none, and fruit and cheese for anyone hungry. He set up his Open Door in a central spot at all kingdom events. He would take, but did not seek donations. He offered substance with a conversation, a laugh or a bit of advice if you wanted it. Mainly, he wanted your story, how you were doing, and please take some more fruit.

Largesse is a research project—what would your persona have given? 10 days of soldiering? A weekend of service as a retainer or event cook? The best herbs from your garden? The choicest soaps from your medicine still room? Appliqued belt tokens? Transportation assistance (which could be a gas card instead of your finest horse flesh)?

This one time, when I was retaining, I was given a herculean task. "Find out who gave Us this!" I failed. And in failing, I let down not just my Crown but the person who had spent so much time making the gift. Please, folks, place a small card with your SCA name and location with your gift! Others might have questions because you did a thing so wonderfully or uniquely or with historical techniques.

We, as a Barony, have a Baron and Baroness who act for us. We can pool our talents and resources and entrust our Baronage to get them where they are needed, where they can be enjoyed and where they just might make someone's day.

#### Tell us about your experience with the SCA:
