From the Seneschal's Pen...

Right now, the kingdom is in its annual lull period: either folks are away at Pennsic or there are few in-kingdom events going on. But as soon as the Pennsic pilgrims return, event activity will pick up again, along with the possibility of new people coming to check us out or (fingers crossed) to join us. With that in mind, I decided to reprise much of last year's August column from The Quill. It still has a lot of validity.

As I write this, I'm almost finished packing to go to Pennsic. By the time you read it, though, I'll likely be on my way home again. A miniature anachronism, perhaps. Or maybe a temporal displacement.

It's easy to feel displaced in such a situation. It's even easier to feel out of place when you're in an unfamiliar setting, such as the first time

you were at an SCA event. All these people dressed in odd clothing, wearing apparently important jewelry, hitting each other with sticks (and no one seems to protest), doing or talking about things that aren't common to the 21st century U.S.A. Who wouldn't feel out of place??

Think back (for some of you that may be WAY back) to your own first event. Did someone notice that you were new? Come up to you and offer to introduce you to people who already were doing the kinds of things in which you'd expressed an interest? Did anyone explain what you were seeing (the combat; behaviors in Court or around certain people)? Or were you left to fend for yourself and, with any luck, figure it out by yourself?

If they did help you - Excellent! If not, we let you down. It's with good reason that most chapters have a Chatelain: a person responsible for the care and well-being of newcomers and guests. But that one person can't be everywhere and do everything for our newcomers. That is why it's often said that, in the SCA, 'every person is [or should be] a chatelain.' In Nottinghill Coill, we're fortunate to have some very good and diligent Chatelains: Lady Marie Helene of the New Forest (Brockore Abbey and Cydllan Downs), Lady Ceara of Novgorod (Falcon Cree), Lady Elisabeth von Basel (Ritterwald) and Lady Altani Bayar Vashir (Nottinghill Coill.) Say 'Thanks' to them next time you see them and try to make their lives a bit easier by being a chatelain yourself. Be as welcoming and helpful as you would have liked someone to be when you were just starting out. The barony, the kingdom, and the SCA will be better places because of your effort.

REMINDER: A few weeks after I return from Pennsic it will be time to take the next step toward having new Baronage: requesting

Letters of Intent / Interest. However, you won't be able to express your opinion to Their Majesties (the ones who will be TRM at the time of the investiture) unless you have current membership and your address is upto-date. The choice of Baronage will affect all of us, whether we just joined or have been participating for over 20 years. Make sure your voice is heard by ensuring that you're still an active member. Thanks.

And to everyone who is at Pennsic, SAFE TRAVELS! I look forward to seeing you there, and safely back home later this month.

Honey Wine/Mulsum

Ingredients:

Honey

• Dry White wine

Modern Recipe:

- Warm honey
- Add wine and stir
- Chill before serving (it tastes better when chilled but not easily chilled in Roman times, so store in a cool dry place until served.)

From De Agriculture, Cato

Latin:

Ex oleis albis nigris variisque nucleos eicito. Sic condito. Concidito ipsas, addito oleum, acetum, coriandrum, cuminum, feniculum, rutam, mentam. In orcuam condito, oleum supra siet. Ita utito.

English:

Remove the kernels from green, black or varicolored olives. Season them as follows: chop them up, add oil, vinegar, coriander, cumin, fennel, rue, mint. Put them in a jar, with olive oil on top. Ready to use.

Ingredients:

- 3 ounces of whole green olives;
- 3 ounces of whole black olives:
- 1 tsp of cumin seeds;
- 1/2 tsp of fennel seeds;
- A bunch of fresh coriander leaves;
- A sprig of rue (or substitute fresh fennel leaves or omit);
- 2 or 3 mint leaves:
- 2 TB olive oil;
- 3 TB white wine vinegar

Modern Recipe:

- Buy pitted olives or use olive pitter.
- Grind cumin and fennel seeds in spice grinder to a powder.
- Finely chop the coriander, rue and mint.
- Roughly chop the olives, dress with olive oil and vinegar;
- Add the herbs.
- Toss ingredients together in a bowl;
- Add a drop more vinegar if desired.
- Serve with plenty of crusty bread.


